Saving the Lives of Healthcare Workers in the Philippines

Project Background

COVID-19 is one of the gravest threats to global health today. Since the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 as a pandemic, the Philippines has accounted for more than 100,000 confirmed cases and 2,000 deaths. Furthermore, according to the Philippines' Health Ministry, at least 1,000 of the confirmed cases thus far are healthcare workers (HCWs). The high rate of infection among HCWs is linked to the shortage of personal protective equipment (PPE), chronic lack of doctors and nurses, and high levels of exposure to COVID-19 infected individuals. Consequently, hospitals and other health facilities are overwhelmed, unable to care for rapidly growing population in need of healthcare.

Project HOPE and ASSIST, with support from multi-stakeholder partnerships, aim to save the lives of HCWs in the Philippines and contribute to the global fight against COVID-19 through the delivery of needed supplies and skills training. **Project HOPE Emergency Response** has three principal strategies to support the frontlines in the Philippines.

Strategy 1: Protect HCWs during health service delivery



Protect HCWs by procuring and distributing PPEs and other product needs to ensure their safety and protection as they work to care for and save COVID-19 patients.

Objective: Purchase and distribute 8,000 kits of PPEs to approximately 12 health facilities in the Philippines.

Strategy 2: Roll-out of HCW training on COVID-19 preparedness and response



Roll-out and cascade training programs to various healthcare workers, trainers, and healthcare specialists to rapidly and sustainably scale-up the Philippines' COVID-19 preparedness and response.

Objective: Train 100 master trainers and 5,000 HCWs that will implement and share their learnings and best practices.

Strategy 3: Strengthen COVID-19 IPC at health facilities to suppress healthcare associated infections



Support hospitals and health facilities with technical assistance for improved infection prevention controls (IPC) management through the identification of gaps and needs and the implementation of improved controls, practices, and protocols.

Objective: Improve IPC in at least 12 targeted referral hospitals/health facilities dealing with COVID-19.
